FINANCING OPTIONS



1. Considering the advanced level of this course, a prerequisite is necessary to guarantee that all participants receive the highest level of instruction without the need to review the basics. Dentists are required to view a webinar and take a pretest. For information about the webinar go to the training center website at www.joemassad.com and visit the Continuing Education page.

The Massad Center for Higher Learning offers a series of three two-day hands-on/over-the-shoulder courses for the dentist and one assistant accompanying her/him at no additional fee. Each course will have limited attendance.

We have developed treatment protocols based on a combination of carefully selected singular prosthetic concepts. These concepts have been proven anatomically and physiologically, as well as documented by a preponderance of literature. When these are combined, the results have been proven to be superior when compared to traditional or other art-driven methods.

2. **Class 1:** This is an introductory class two days in length. The first day consists of eight hours of lecture, and the second day consists of “over the shoulder” demonstrations of actual patient treatment being rendered by Dr. Massad and his faculty members. The three spacious treatment operatories, as well as large video monitors in convenient locations, allow each dentist and assistant ample viewing vantage-points. These treatments will fully demonstrate the “A to Z” methods which comprise the Massad protocol and techniques. The Massad Prosthetic Technicians will also demonstrate the various laboratory procedures critical to the technique. The dentists and assistants will find, as Dr. Massad says, that “Seeing is Believing”.

3. **Class 2: Day One Morning.** This course will detail the assessment, diagnosis, treatment planning and fee analysis of both the totally edentulous and implant retained overdenture patient. As a general rule, edentulous patients present more challenges to the dentist than do fully dentate patients. With 36 million edentulous patients in the United States, there exists a enormous window of opportunity for dentists who are well informed and trained in edentulous procedures. Dr. Massad believes that once a dentist has mastered both the art and science of treating the edentulous patient, identifying and solving many of the problems associated with dentate or fixed implant case becomes much easier. The successful treatment of the edentulous patient requires a keen understanding of how to redevelop the optimal vertical and horizontal relationships of the teeth, as well as how to position the prosthesis to achieve compatibility with muscle function. Mastering the treatment of the edentulous patient will create the confidence necessary to properly treat implant overdenture and fixed implant patients. The examination formula, which has been developed and tested for over ten years by the entire Massad teaching group, will also be discussed in detail. Dentists will look over-the-shoulder of Dr. Massad and/or a member of his team performing the assessment examination and detailing the treatment options with patients.

During day one of Class 2 (generally in the afternoon), a surgical procedure placing two to four mandibular implants will be performed on a live patient by a Team Massad surgeon. The surgeon may utilize both standard and small diameter implants in the procedure. Upon surgery completion, Dr. Massad or a member of his team will deliver the completed prosthesis. The learning objective of this exercise is to demonstrate how, using advance planning with scientifically and physiological appropriate concepts, predictable superior results can be achieved (even when the prosthesis cannot be tried-in prior to surgery!)

On day two of Class 2, the course attendees will make impressions on live patients, while the dental assistants will perform the support procedures necessary for clinical success. The impression experience will include edentulous, partially edentulous, implant overdenture, and immediate denture patients. Approximately six patients are used during this course so each dentist will be allowed to make at least two impressions on a

live patient, with the remainder being performed on epoxy models. Also during this second day of the course, each dentist will also be taught the proper method of performing a direct implant retention pickup on a removable prosthesis. This will be demonstrated on a patient by Dr. Massad and/or a member of the faculty, followed by the dentist performing this procedure on a prefabricated epoxy model mounted on an articulator.

4. **Class 3:** This is a continuation of Class 2 and is also two days in duration. The course is also a combination hands-on/over the shoulder experience, and is once again limited attendance. Day one of the course is primarily focused on record making and delivery of the completed prostheses. Cases will be varied, with totally edentulous patients and implant retained overdenture patients.

The dentists will observe as Dr. Massad or one of his faculty demonstrate how the challenging task of determining and recording a patient's proper vertical and horizontal position can be achieved in minutes. Today's most taught method of determining centric relation, bimanual manipulation, can often prove frustrating for practitioners. This is because the result is dependent upon both the skill level of the dentist as well as the cooperation of the patient. The recording methods taught in this course are proven to be predictable, accurate, and easily achieved by all dental practitioners..

Day two of Class 3 will focus on placement of implant abutments, as well as achieving proper alignment of abutments in difficult situations. Each participant will observe Dr. Massad or a faculty member as they demonstrate realignment of implant abutments to an ideal parallel arrangement. The dentist will then be able to duplicate this operation, using a specially prepared model. After alignment, the participants will secure the abutments in the proper position. Several examples and scenarios will be utilized.
